Full Day Outreach Workshop

Coastal Waters | Grades 5-7 | 9:30am - 2:30pm | Fridays: October 5, 12 & November 16, 23 2018 - Fridays: January 11 – June 21 2019

Join us to uncover the complexity of the BC coastline. Students are immersed into the ideas of interconnection, ecosystems, water cycles and shoreline wildlife, with examples of coastal Indigenous artwork. Using printmaking, stamping, drawing and collage, students develop individual mixed-media works that contribute to a group classroom ecosystem project.

Part Day Outreach Workshops

Crossroads: Salish Art & Pop Culture | Grades 3-12

Mondays: October 1 – December 10 2018 - Tuesdays: January 8 – March 12 2019

Investigating contemporary works by Coast Salish artists, students learn about traditional design elements represented in Coast Salish art. The class also considers how and why these artists are merging popular images, such as *Starbucks* and *Coca Cola* logos with traditional artistic designs. Students create a work of art inspired by concepts found in the Salish Weave Education Collection.

Collection Discovery | Grades K-7

Wednesdays: October 3 – December 12 2018 - Thursdays: January 10 – June 2019

Discover the Gallery's Permanent Art Collection, focusing on handmade prints by Indigenous artists. Using real artworks from the collection, students compare the different techniques used and elements of meaning in the works. The class considers the significance of the ecosystem and environment represented in the select works. Students create their own art piece inspired by their connection with the environment and explore how different mediums work together.

Structures & Cities | Grades K-7

Thursdays: October 18 – December 13 2018 - Wednesdays: January 9 – June 19 2019

Imagine, balance, construct and combine materials to engineer an exciting mini city. Students learn about physics and connecting techniques they can use to support their structures. Elements of colour, pattern, and recycled materials encourage students to get creative. Focus can be adjusted- perhaps a realistic, futuristic, space-age or environmentally sensitive city could fit your curriculum.

Where Coast Salish Art & Math Collide | Grades 8-12

Mondays: January 7 – June 17 2019

Discover the interwoven worlds of math and art throughout history and explore how math inspires art in this unique outreach program geared towards secondary students. Using tessellations as a foundation, variations upon each workshop caters to specific grade levels. Each workshop explores traditional design elements represented in Coast Salish contemporary art, and examines artists who use tessellations in their work.
