8 EASY STEPS TO VOTING

1 Get to know your candidates

Familiarize yourself with the candidates and learn who is running for office. Use the List of Candidates tear-out to mark your choice(s) and take them with you to the voting location.

2 Choose a voting location

Decide which of the 32 voting locations is most convenient for you or visit one of the 6 advance voting opportunities listed on your voter card. See pages 28-29 of this guide.

3 Bring your voter card

If you are registered to vote, you will receive a voter card in the mail. Detach, bring the card with your name listed and one piece of identification to make your voting experience seamless. If you are not registered to vote, please bring two pieces of identification, one which contains your signature, to the voting location to register before you vote.

4 When you arrive at your voting location

You will be greeted, have the chance to ask questions and mark a practice ballot if you wish. Please have your voter card and one piece of identification or, if you do not have a voter card, two (2) pieces of acceptable identification. The greeter will direct you to the first available Election Official.

5 Sign in and receive your ballot

The Election Official will review your voter card and/or ID(s). You will be asked to review a declaration and sign the voting book to receive your ballot and a secrecy folder.

6 Enter the voting booth

You will then proceed to the voting booth, where you will have privacy to mark your ballot.

7 Cast your vote

Once completed, place your ballot into the secrecy folder and continue to the vote-counting machine. A machine attendant will ask you to feed your ballot into the machine.

8 Receive your sticker

You will receive an "I Voted" sticker from the machine attendant. Share this on social media using the hashtag, [#BurnabyVotes](https://twitter.com/BurnabyVotes).

VOTER INFORMATION

Am I eligible to vote?

You are eligible to vote as a resident elector in the City of Burnaby if you meet the following requirements at the time of voting:

- 18 years of age or older on the day of registration or general voting day;
- Canadian citizen;
- Resident of British Columbia, as determined in accordance with applicable legislation, for at least 6 months immediately before the day of registration (April 14, 2022);
- Resident of the City of Burnaby, as determined in accordance with applicable legislation, on the day of registration or voting day; and
- Not disqualified from the *Local Government Act* and/or *School Act* or any other enactment from voting in an election or otherwise disqualified by law.

What ID should I bring to vote?

The City of Burnaby uses the Provincial Voters' List from Elections BC as the Burnaby List of Electors. If your name appears on this list, a voter card will be mailed to your address in September. Bring your voter card and one piece of identification to make your voting experience seamless.

If you are a new or unregistered voter, or are updating your personal information on your voter card, bring two (2) pieces of acceptable identification, that provide evidence of your identity and place of residence (one item must contain your signature).

Acceptable identification includes:

- British Columbia Driver's Licence
- BC Identification Card issued by ICBC
- Owner's Certificate of Insurance and Vehicle Licence issued by ICBC
- Canadian Passport or Citizenship Card issued by Citizenship and Immigration Canada
- Social Insurance Number card issued by the Government of Canada
- Ministry of Social Development and Economic Security Request for Continued Assistance Form SDES8
- Secure Certificate of Indian Status (Status Card)
- Birth certificate
- BC Services Card or BC CareCard or BC Gold CareCard
- Property tax notice issued by the City of Burnaby
- Utility bill (electricity, natural gas, telephone, cable or internet service)

Who am I voting for?

In the 2022 Local Government Election, eligible voters will cast their ballot to elect up to:

- Eight (8) councillors
- Seven (7) school trustees for Burnaby School District 41

The City received only one nomination for the position of Mayor. As a result, Mike Hurley will be officially acclaimed to the role and sworn in for a new term along with newly elected councillors in a ceremony on November 2, 2022.

Voting for 2022 park dedication

In 1990, the City of Burnaby began an ongoing process to dedicate certain city lands as park in perpetuity. A total of 3,093.46 acres (1,251.88 hectares) has been dedicated since that time.

In 2022, Burnaby Council proposes to dedicate additional park lands and is seeking the opinion of the community through an assent voting process.

In addition to voting for a mayor, councillors and school trustees, qualified voters will also vote on the dedication of the following park lands:

Cariboo and Brunette River conservation lands

The proposed dedication is an area of approximately 55.66 acres (22.51 hectares) located in the southeast region of Burnaby.

Stoney Creek park and trail system

The proposed dedication is an area of approximately 24.67 acres (9.97 hectares) located in the northeast region of Burnaby.

Deer Lake Park

The proposed dedication is an area of approximately 29.42 acres (11.97 hectares) located in the southwest region of Burnaby.

Burnaby Lake Park system

The proposed dedication is an area of approximately 94.30 acres (38.52 hectares) located in the northwest region of Burnaby.

Burnaby is fortunate to have an extensive and diverse range of parks, conservation areas and public open spaces. Major natural landscapes and resources conserved include river estuary, marine foreshore, mountain and ravine forest, lakes and waterways. To date, our parks and open space system extends more than 5,482 acres representing about 24.8 percent of the total area of the City. The City and the electorate have previously taken significant steps to protect these irreplaceable park and natural areas for future generations through the park dedication process. The properties proposed for dedication in the 2022 local government election continues this process.

Can I get help with voting?

If you require translation or other assistance to read or mark a ballot, we encourage you to bring someone with you. Persons assisting a voter to mark a ballot will be required to sign a declaration affirming that they will:

- Translate or assist to the best of their ability;
- Mark the ballot per the wishes of the elector;
- Preserve the secrecy of the ballot for the elector; and
- Refrain from influencing the elector as to how they should vote.

In addition, several of our voting locations have multi-lingual Election Officials to help as required. If necessary, the Presiding Election Official may also be able to provide voter assistance for visual disabilities.

Curbside voting

If you have difficulty entering the voting location, you may ask to receive and mark your ballot outside (curbside voting). Please bring someone with you who can advise the Presiding Election Official that you need assistance. Curbside voting is available at all voting locations except at The Amazing Brentwood and Metropolis at Metrotown. Election workers will come to your vehicle and complete the steps necessary for voting.

I don't live in Burnaby but own a property in the City. Can I vote?

If you own property in the City of Burnaby (residential property only), but you live elsewhere in BC, you are eligible to vote if you meet the following requirements at the time of voting:

- 18 years of age or older on the day of registration or general voting day;
- Canadian citizen;
- Resident of British Columbia, as determined in accordance with applicable legislation, for at least 6 months immediately before the day of registration (April 14, 2022);
- Registered owner of real property in the City of Burnaby for at least 30 days immediately before the day of registration;
- An individual not holding the real property in trust for a corporation or any other trust;
- Not entitled to register as a resident elector in the City of Burnaby;
- Not registered as a non-resident property elector in relation to any other parcel of real property in the City of Burnaby;

- If there is more than one registered owner, only one individual may register and vote in relation to the real property and the person doing so must have received the written consent (Non-Resident Property Elector Consent Form) of the majority of individuals registered as owners of the real property; and
- Not disqualified from the *Local Government Act* and/or *School Act* or any other enactment from voting in an election or otherwise disqualified by law.

Non-resident voters can register before the election at the Burnaby Election Office, during advance voting opportunities (October 1, 5 or 8) or on general voting day (Saturday, October 15). Registration will take place when you arrive to vote. Complete the application form and consent form (if needed), available at [Burnaby.ca/Elections](https://burnaby.ca/Elections). Bring your proof of ownership and identification to ensure a seamless voting experience.

NOTE: In accordance with S. 67 of the *Local Government Act* and S. 42 of the *School Act*, the only persons who are registered owners, either as joint tenants or tenants-in-common, are individuals who are not holding the property in trust for a corporation or another trust. A person may only register as a Non-Resident Property Elector in relation to one parcel of property in the City of Burnaby and must provide proof of ownership of the property on which registration is based along with the signed consent form where applicable.

When and where can I vote?

On **Saturday, October 15, 2022**, eligible voters may vote at any one of the 32 voting locations conveniently located throughout Burnaby.

All voting locations are open from 8 am to 8 pm. To find a voting location near you, refer to the pull-out section on page 29 of this Voter Guide.

Advance voting days

All voters have the choice to vote on general voting day (Saturday, October 15, 2022) or during advance voting opportunities on:

- Saturday, October 1
- Wednesday, October 5
- Saturday, October 8

All advance voting locations are open from 8 am to 8 pm on every voting day. Advance voting opportunities are available at six convenient locations:

- Bonsor Recreation Complex
- Cameron Recreation Complex
- Confederation Seniors' Community Centre
- Edmonds Community Centre
- Metropolis at Metrotown (G22)
- The Amazing Brentwood (Unit 17)
