ARCHAEOLOGY REVIEW

The City reviews all building permit applications for proximity to a registered archaeological site. Projects located within 50 meters of a registered archaeological site are flagged when a building permit is received, and owners are contacted to alert them to their requirements under the Province of BC's Heritage Conservation Act.

A customer service staff member in the Building or Planning division can provide a registered property owner with information about whether their property has been flagged by the City of Burnaby as being located within 50 meters of a registered archaeology site.

If your property is flagged by the City of Burnaby as being located within 50 meters of registered archaeology site, you are advised to contact the Development and Urban Design Division for further information.

Please note that the Archaeology Branch of the Province of BC is responsible for the administration of the Heritage Conservation Act. Municipal or regional governments do not administer it. The City of Burnaby relies on information provided by the Province of BC, and the information it provides to applicants regarding proximity to registered archaeology sites is based on a search of Provincial records. There are archaeological sites in BC that are unknown and not recorded in these records. Applicants may wish to contact the Government of British Columbia's Archaeology Branch to confirm the accuracy of information provided by the City. The City makes no representations or warranties with respect to the accuracy or completeness of this information. People relying upon it do so at their own risk.
