Adult Ceramics Program Names

In order to help guide students to the correct course offering, we are implementing levels: Ceramics I, Ceramics II, Ceramics III. Each level refers to the minimum skill level required to take the course.

Pre-requisites may be added in future to the registration system; this is still to be determined whether it is necessary and requires 2-3 seasons of registration history to be built up in the new system.

The Prefixes:

- Ceramics I no experience required
- Ceramics II must be able to throw a 4 inch cylinder
- Ceramics III must be able to throw a 6-8 inch cylinder
- Ceramics Workshop minimum skill level required will be in listed in the course description

Returning students are always welcome and it is encouraged that students take courses at their skill level more than once to develop mastery.

The levels are designed to help students achieve success. There is a certain amount of self-assessment that goes along with this system. A student at the Ceramics I level (with little to no experience) who takes a Ceramics III level course will be frustrated and not enjoy the class. Be honest and kind with your self-assessment, and give yourself the time to explore each level fully, to cultivate a successful learning experience.
