» 6.7 CA - Construction Manager - Cameron Community Centre & Library - CCDC5B

City Council awarded a partial contract award to Graham Construction & Engineering LP for an estimated total cost of \$78,750,000, for a variety of pre-construction activities for the new Cameron Community Centre & Library, including the demolition of the existing facilities. The overall project includes a new community pool, gymnasium space, exercise rooms, multi-purpose meeting rooms and an expanded library.

» 6.8 CA - RCMP New Detachment IPD Team

City Council awarded a contract to the Safe Community Partners Integrated Project Delivery (IPD) team for an estimated total cost of \$6,496,225. This group will be responsible for advancing pre-construction work on the new RCMP detachment in Burnaby to replace the existing RCMP building at Deer Lake, which is now 53 years old. This team will also prepare a full report for Council, including an in-depth project cost, schedule and scope for construction.

» 6.10 CA - Construction Manager Burnaby Lake Pedestrian Overpass (CCDC5B)

City Council awarded a contract to Jacob Bros. Construction Inc. an estimated total cost of \$21,128,634 for the construction of the Burnaby Lake Overpass project. This new pedestrian-cyclist overpass will span across the Trans-Canada Highway (Highway 1) creating a critical north-south link between key regional trail networks and destinations within Burnaby.

» 7.3 Environment Committee - RE: Ze Building Retrofit Strategy - Preliminary Draft

City Council was provided with a preliminary draft of the City's Zero Emissions Building Retrofit Strategy. This strategy will support building owners and occupants to retrofit their buildings to use more efficient and less carbon intensive energy sources.

» 8.1 BC Parkway Planning Process

City Council received an update on the BC Parkway Enhancement Project, which would transform the BC Parkway into a fully integrated linear park, featuring lively public spaces and opportunities for recreation, commerce and art. The framework provided to council outlines a multi-phase development plan, beginning with a public awareness and community consultation phase.
