- **Police Information Check**

To become a Block Watch Captain or Co-Captain, you must complete a Police Information Check. The police information check form is available at the Burnaby RCMP Detachment. You must **attend in-person** to fill out the form and provide two pieces of valid government issued identification. For a list of accepted identification, please visit [burnaby.rcmp.ca](http://burnaby.rcmp.ca) and click on front counter services. There is no cost for the police information check.

## Block Watch Role Descriptions

---

Recommended guidelines for Block Watch team members:

### Block Watch Captains and Co-Captains

The Block Watch Captains and Co-Captains are responsible for delivering the Block Watch Program in their neighbourhood. Responsibilities include the following:

- Complete an application form and a police information check form.
- Attend a mandatory training session.
- Canvass your neighbourhood to explain what the Block Watch Program entails and encourage participation.
- Develop and maintain a team 'Block Map' and/or a 'Participant List'; and submit both to the Crime Prevention Unit annually in September.
- Arrange an initial Block Watch team meeting with your participants to implement the program.
- Hold an annual Block Watch team meeting to maintain the program. These meetings can be formal or informal such as a BBQ or block party.
- Attend at least one presentation (Safe Community Series) annually hosted by the Crime Prevention Unit.
- Establish an effective communication chain with your participants and e-mail fan-out information to your group. Develop a phone system for team members who don't have access to e-mail.
- Serve as a liaison between the Block Watch participants and the Crime Prevention Unit.
- Watch out for your neighbours' homes and property.
- Report suspicious or criminal activity to the Burnaby RCMP Non-Emergency at 604-646-9999. For crimes in progress, dial 9-1-1.
- After reporting incidents to police, inform the Crime Prevention Unit of all incidents.
- Note down incidents on 'Incident Reporting Sheet' and notify your group of incidents.
- Determine interest in joining the Block Watch program from your neighbourhood residents.
- Welcome new residents to your block.
- Respect the confidentiality and privacy of all participants.

### Block Watch Participants

- Watch out for your neighbours' homes and property.
- Report suspicious activity to police and then to the Captain/Co-Captain.
- Attend annual Block Watch meetings, when possible.
- Share an interest in community safety and crime prevention with your neighbours.

## Steps to Starting a Block Watch Team

---

Follow these steps to start a Block Watch group in your neighbourhood:

### 1. Contact the Crime Prevention Unit

The Crime Prevention Unit is comprised of a Crime Prevention Services Supervisor and Crime Prevention Programs Facilitators that administer the British Columbia Block Watch program in Burnaby.

If a Block Watch already *exists* on your block, you can contact the Crime Prevention Unit to get you connected with your Captain and/or Co-Captain.

If a Block Watch *does not exist* on your block, join the program as a Captain. You can e-mail the Crime Prevention Unit at [blockwatch@burnaby.ca](mailto:blockwatch@burnaby.ca) or contact **604-294-7795** to start a Block Watch group.

### 2. Determine Interest on Your Block

Before you enroll in the Block Watch Program, you need to find out whether your neighbours would be interested in forming a Block Watch team. You can go door-to-door and ask your neighbours if they want to join the program. Determine interest from at least 6 households and select a Co-Captain. For condominiums, you will want to have Block Watch added to a council agenda for consideration.

### 3. Submit a Team Application and Complete a Police Information Check

Each Captain and Co-Captain must submit a Block Watch team application and undergo a police information check:

- Submit the completed Block Watch team application form:
  - E-mail the Crime Prevention Unit at [blockwatch@burnaby.ca](mailto:blockwatch@burnaby.ca) (preferred method); *or*
  - Mail to the Crime Prevention Unit - Main Floor, 4949 Canada Way, Burnaby, BC V5G 1M2
- Complete a police information check in-person at the Burnaby RCMP Detachment. There is no fee for the police information check. Previous or existing police information checks are not applicable.

### 4. Attend a Mandatory Captain/Co-Captain Training Session

When applicants have cleared the police information check, a facilitator will contact successful candidates with information on how to join the training session.

## 5. Build Your Group by Signing Up Participants

For single family households, start your group with the street(s) that the Captain(s) and Co-Captain(s) live on, then work towards having commitments from at least **6 households**. Recruit the homes facing your front door and/or alley side and the homes at the ends of the next block. For strata condominiums, connect with residents on your floor and post a notice in the common area for residents to contact you.

For neighbours who agreed to join your group, have them add their contact information to the '**Team Participant List**' or '**Team Map**'. Inform them that this information will remain confidential between other team participants and the Crime Prevention Unit. Explain that the information is used as a communication chain between team members and the Crime Prevention Unit to share crime prevention information and suspicious activities in the neighbourhood. Participants do not need to get a police information check.

## 6. Submit an Annual Team Map and/or a Team Participant List

You will need to complete an initial **Team Map** and/or a **Team Participant List** and submit both to the Crime Prevention Unit. A sample map is provided at the training. You must submit an accurate list and map of all participants on an **annual basis** in September in one of the following manners:

## 7. Arrange an Initial Block Watch Team Meeting

After you have been trained, you will be asked to arrange your **First Block Watch Team Meeting**. In most cases, the Crime Prevention Unit's staff will attend your team meeting. A minimum of 3 weeks' notice is required for attendance. In addition to networking, important topics can be discussed such as learn how to identify and report suspicious or criminal activity, discuss common neighbourhood concerns, and set up your communication chain. Your **Team Map** and **Participant List** can be completed during your first meeting.
