WOMEN'S PERSONAL SAFETY — SESSION SUMMARY HERE'S WHAT YOU MISSED (April 24th, 2025):

Gender-based Violence Statistics:

- Nearly half (48%) of Canadian women experience intimate partner violence, with Burnaby RCMP handling over 500 related cases in 2023 alone. Femicide rates have doubled in BC since 2022.
- Many women experiencing homelessness are not counted in official statistics due to couch-surfing or staying in unsafe situations. Only 5% of sexual assaults are reported to the police, underscoring barriers in the legal system.
- 61% of women and gender-diverse people in Canada report experiencing gendered digital harm. Recognizing red-flags such as receiving suspicious messages is vital in both physical and digital spaces.

Support & Resources

• Atira Women's Resource Society operates over 35 housing programs and 20 non-residential services like Legal Advocacy Clinics and Stopping the Violence Counseling, offering trauma-informed, culturally safe, and women-specific spaces—especially for older, Indigenous, and marginalized women.

Safety Tips & Recommendations

• Key safety strategies include walking confidently in well-lit areas, sharing your location with trusted people, using multi-factor-authentication, and limiting real-time posts online.
