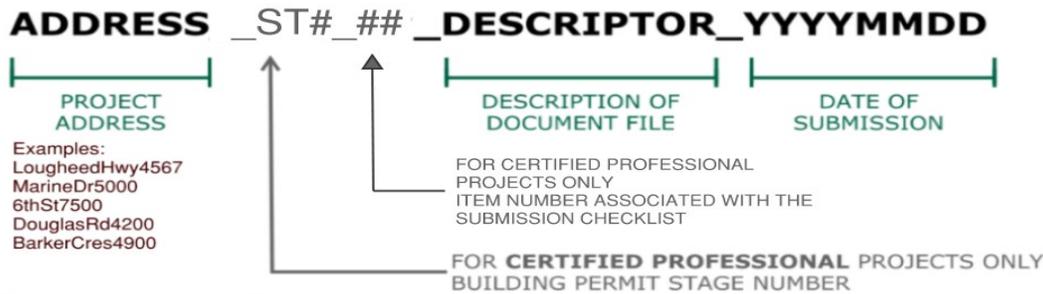
Digital Building Permit Applications

The purpose of this information guide is to outline requirements for online building permit applications for residential, commercial, industrial, institutional and Certified Professional projects. This guide does not apply to “Tenant Improvement Building Permit Applications.”

“The information contained within this guide is for convenience only and does not serve to substitute or supersede applicable City Bylaws, governing Provincial / Federal Codes, and laws. Any references to Bylaws, Codes and laws pertain to those effective at the time of this guide’s creation or revision. If the date on this guide exceeds three (3) years, the information contained may be outdated- in such circumstance, refer to the current Bylaws, Codes and laws. Building Owners are responsible for ensuring that any existing or proposed construction, and other works, comply with all applicable Bylaws, Codes and laws.”

File Naming Convention

To ensure that submission documents can be promptly identified and processed by our staff, it is crucial that applicants adhere to the following file naming convention prior to uploading to My Permits Portal.



For consistency, descriptors shall use the abbreviations established on the table below, which our staff will be familiar with. Otherwise, descriptors shall be spelled out.

* **Plumbing drawings** submitted for R1 Small-Scale Multi-Unit Housing (SSMUH) applications will require separate isometric drawings, onsite services drawings, and sprinkler drawings (if applicable). Please denote them as “Plm-Iso”, “Plum-Onsite”, and “Plm-Spk”.

** To distinguish between drawings for **sprinklers** and **special fire suppression systems**, please use “Spk” for sprinkler systems designed to NFPA 13, 13R, or 13D, and “Fire” for other special fire suppression systems such as NFPA 96, NFPA 2001, NFPA 11, etc.

Electronic File Requirements

The following checklist outlines the requirements for all digital submission documents. Incomplete or inadequate documentation will be rejected and may delay your application intake process.

Do's	Don'ts
<input type="checkbox"/> <u>Clearly depict</u> the scope of work related to the application in the online portal (proposed use, number of storeys, area of work, etc.).	<input type="checkbox"/> <u>Do not lock</u> , apply passwords, or include any other document restrictions that would prevent City staff from stamping and signing.
<input type="checkbox"/> Upload documents (schedules, forms, and reports) <u>as individual PDF files</u> using the file naming convention above.	<input type="checkbox"/> <u>Do not submit scanned paper drawings.</u>
<input type="checkbox"/> <u>Complete and sign</u> all necessary forms. (Refer to next section regarding digital authentication)	<input type="checkbox"/> <u>Do not separate</u> individual pages from documents and drawing sets (by discipline), e.g. multiple sheets from a structural drawing set must be combined into a single PDF file.
<input type="checkbox"/> Ensure drawings have a <u>blank space in the title block</u> on the same location on each page for staff to apply the City's stamp.	<input type="checkbox"/> <u>Each PDF file must not exceed 1GB</u> , larger files may cause issues when uploading.

Digital Signatures and Professional Seals

For Professionals – Architects, engineers and surveyors must adhere to the digital authentication requirements from their respective associations:

- [The Architectural Institute of British Columbia \(AIBC\)](#)
- [Engineers and Geoscientists British Columbia \(EGBC\)](#)
- [The Association of British Columbia Land Surveyors \(ABCLS\)](#)

Every sheet of drawings and Letters of Assurance must display:

- An image of the professional's seal / stamp issued by their association
- The professional's signature adjacent to or across the professional seal
- The date at the time of sealing

In addition, every document that is required to be digitally authenticated must contain a digital certificate endorsed by the professional's association (i.e. Nortaius for architects and engineers, and/or Juricert for surveyors).

Only 1 (one) digital certificate per individual is required for a set of drawings and/or required documents. Do not apply a digital certificate to each page of a PDF files as the file size will significantly increase.

In general, it is the professionals' responsibility to follow the guidelines set forth by their corresponding associations and ensure the following:

- Electronic stamping is not an acceptable equivalent to digitally signing a document; a digital certificate is mandatory for staff to verify authenticity of submitted drawings or documents.
- Scanned or photocopied seals ("wet") and signatures without digital certificate will not be accepted.
- Do not certify ("lock") your documents prior to submission- this will prevent our staff from applying subsequent stamps or signatures.
- Clearly provide Permit to Practice number where applicable for engineers (every sheet for drawings, at a conspicuous location for other types of documents).

For Non-Professionals – For owners or agents not involved in a technical role, signatures on digital administrative documents do not need the same digital authentication as professional signatures. Scanned forms with the owner's or agent's handwritten signature are acceptable. However, using an electronic signing tool is recommended.
